Health Care





Kidney Disease-Related Deaths




Death due to kidney disease occurs more often in Asian Americans compared to whites4



IgA Nephropathy (IgAN) In Patients Of Asian Descent



What Is IgAN?

IgAN is an autoimmune disease that affects the kidneys5

IgAN diagnosis is done by kidney biopsy⁵

How Is IgAN Diagnosed?



Individuals of East Asian descent have the highest numbers of diagnoses, possibly due to increased screening and kidney biopsies⁶

IgAN symptoms, progression, and long-term health varies by ethnicity⁷

What Is The Kidney Failure Risk?



Patients with Pacific Asian ancestry diagnosed with IgAN have a higher risk of kidney failure compared to other individuals worldwide8

Numbers Of IgAN Diagnosed Patients:

The highest numbers of IgAN diagnosed patients are found in China and Singapore compared to worldwide numbers⁵

KIDNEY TRANSPLANTATION IN ASIAN AMERICAN & PACIFIC ISLANDERS

- Racial and ethnic disparities in US living donor kidney transplantation (LDKT) continue despite efforts to reduce disparities9
- Asian Americans have lower LDKT rates at 2 years after being placed on the transplant waitlist compared to white patients⁹




Time-Related Trends In Living Donor Kidney Transplantation (LDKT) By Candidate Race/Ethnicity9
